

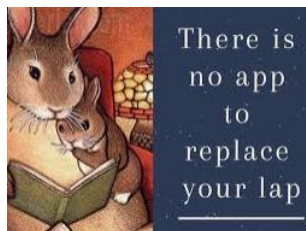
# World Book Day Activities

This year our World Book Day activities will run across Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> and Friday 5<sup>th</sup> March. There will be some online live sessions and a special visitor to an assembly. ## Book Den/Wild reading

Can your child create a den or somewhere cosy to snuggle up and read their favourite story?



Or they could do some wild reading and send in a picture of them reading in a wild,

weird and wonderful place, such as outside in a den/ on a walk.

## Finger Puppets

Can you choose your favourite story and make some finger puppets to act out the story? There is a template in the downloads. If you wish to use that, you could even make your own puppets out of material or wooden spoons if you wished to! Be as creative as you like 😊



## Book scavenger hunt

Can you choose your favourite 2 books you have at home and look for the items on the scavenger hunt sheet in the downloads? How many of the items can you find in the book?

## Guess the book character

Choose a character from a book. Can you find/make some props to give clues as to who the character is? Take a picture of your clues and put them on the Google Classroom page for the other children to comment on and guess. We did something similar in class. When I was introducing Little Red. I gathered some clues: a basket, fruit, medicine, a red cape. You could find clues around your house, make them or even draw them.

## Read and follow a recipe

Can you read and share a recipe with your child? Look at some of the features in them: ingredients list, bullet points, numbers, verbs etc.

Have a go at following the recipe and enjoy what you make! I have put some child friendly recipes on the downloads but please feel free to adapt this and make something tasty and follow a recipe of your choice.

### Simple Recipes for Children

The recipes in this pack are intended to introduce children to cooking in a fun and simple way.  
Adult supervision is recommended for all of the activities, especially those involving knives, the oven or the hob. Please ensure you choose recipes that are appropriate for your child's/children's skill level.

### Design your own Mr Men or Little Miss character

First read/ watch some of the Mr Men stories. Can you think of your own character to make and design? You could make a model of them, draw a picture of them. You could even look at all of the characters and make your own family in Mr Men Characters choosing which character would best represent each family member!

Can you say which story you prefer and why? Do you like the original that we have been learning about or do you like this version better?

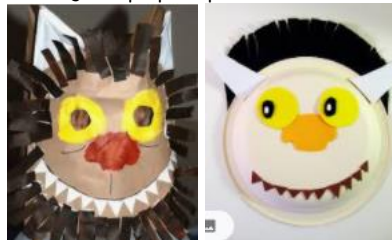
### Make a quiz

### Where the Wild Things are

Read the story of Where the Wild Things are, found in the downloads. Can you design your own wild things mask or character. You could do this out of a paper plate.



### Make your own book

There is a template in the downloads explaining how to make your own book.

You could either re-write one of your favourite stories in the book or you could even make/write your own story! If you wish you make your own story, why not choose your favourite well known story and just change some parts of it?



### Re-create a scene from your favourite book

Can you recreate a scene from your favourite book? You could do this in a shoebox like the examples below. You could also upload a picture of your creation to Google Classroom for the children to guess which book it is from!
