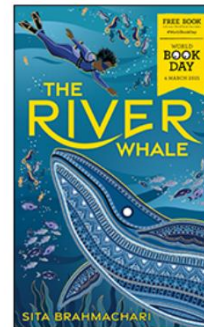
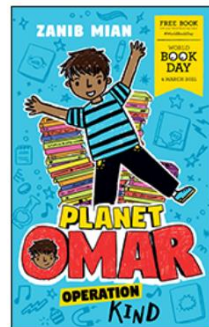
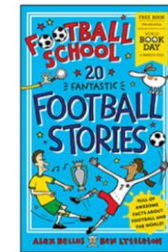
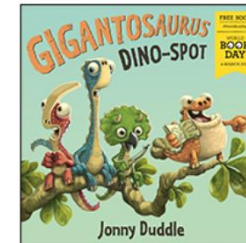
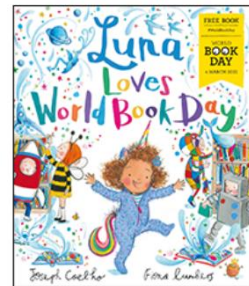
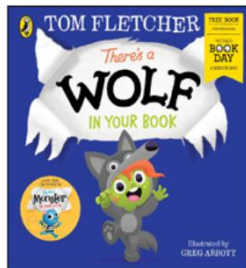


# World Book Day 2021

Go to Andy Tooze assembly at 1.30pm via Zoom on Friday 5 <sup>th</sup> March and complete the follow up activity.	Make a story sack. Choose a book or story that you love and collect some items in a bag that have something to do with it. Can someone else guess the book?	Act out a scene from your favourite story or perform a poem. Are there any objects from around your home that you could use as props?	Write a letter to your favourite author telling them why you love their books and post it to their publisher. You might even get a reply!
Find an old newspaper or magazine. Carefully circle a word from each line to see if you can make a new sentence, a poem or a story. Read it aloud.	Make a list of all the things you read in a day, from the breakfast cereal box in the morning, to the instructions on a board game and the blurb of a book.	Songs are just like poems with music! Play your favourite song and challenge your family to a dancing contest. Make up some new moves and teach it to them!	Create a wordsearch using some vocabulary/characters/settings etc from your favourite story...
Curl up with your grown ups and share a story together. Let your grown up read you a story! Can you visualise it? Draw a picture! Label it using the most memorable/imaginative vocab used by the author to spark your imagination when you read it...</p> <p>OR.... you could use a shoebox to make the scene!</p>

<p>Think back to when we looked at The Nowhere Emporium and we had great fun creating our own rooms that we would put in our emporiums!</p> <p>Imagine you are creating a factory like Charlie and the Chocolate Factory... what different rooms would you have in yours? Why? Be as creative as you want! Get drawing....</p>	<p>Use egg boxes to make characters from a story! You might want to research some examples.</p> <p>Now can you decorate/design your egg box so that it represents a story? e.g. egg box Gruffalo:</p> 	<p>On the theme of eggs, can you decorate an egg and turn it into a book character?</p> <p>Alternatively, we've done this one before, decorate a potato as a book character! Or you could do both...</p>	<p>Find a fun or unusual place to read... the most unusual place will win a prize...</p> <p>Create your own bookmark! Be as creative and imaginative as you could possibly be...</p>
<p>Read to your sibling or a pet... cuddle up to your brother, sister or your pet and share a book together!</p>	<p>Can you turn your favourite story into a comic strip? You might use speech bubbles, thought bubbles or caption boxes...</p>	<p>Create a snack or a recipe based on a story! Be creative.</p>	<p>'The Masked Reader' – Disguise yourselves using a mask, hat, sunglasses etc – be creative – and video record yourself reading a short section of a book or a poem! 😊 Send me in your entries and if we have enough, we will guess who is reading each section...</p>

			
<p>Who is the Reader?</p> <p>Take a photo with your favourite book in front of your face and another one holding it so we can see your face then send it to me or get your grown up to. I will make a Pic Collage of the photos covering faces and put it on Google Classroom so we can guess who is reading which book</p>	<p>Choose your favourite book and make either a short video advert or a poster advert to advertise!</p>	<p>Build a story den at home with your grown ups/siblings/pets and then send some pictures to me of you sharing stories in it with your families, pets, teddies etc. You could also use it to recommend books to each other! Which books would you recommend and why?</p>	<p>Join in with the KS2 book quiz!</p> <p>Can you write your own book quiz for us to complete?</p> <p>We will do this on a Google Meet.</p>

(if enough of you join in!), then the day after, I will post another Pic Collage which shows who is holding which book so you can see if you were correct!			
Redesign your favourite book cover.	Choose an illustration from a book (any book) and write around it everything that you have noticed.	Share a wordless picture book – now it's up to you to re-write/re-tell the story!  Create a story map to go alongside your re-tell.	Using some pegs, create some of your favourite characters from books!
