

Learning at Britannia



Reception

This week Reception have been reading the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. They have even had a visit from a giant in PE! Ask your child to retell you the story at home. Can they use a giant's voice?



Year 1

Year 1 have been enjoying the story of Peter Rabbit. Can you share some other classic Beatrix Potter stories with your child this weekend? Can your child tell you about the character of Peter Rabbit?



Year 2

Year 2 have been enjoying the story Wind in The Willows and discussing the different characters. Ask your child who is their favourite character and why? Can they use a conjunction in their sentence?



Year 3

Year 3 are starting a topic all about the Romans this half term. Can they find out the names of any famous Romans and the reasons they are famous?



Year 4

Year 4 have been learning in history all about World War 2. They have been learning about the land army and rationing. Can they tell you about all they have discovered so far?

Year 5 have started their swimming sessions this week and showed how sensible they are. Well done Year 5 – I am very proud of you!

This week Year 6B have been busy looking at stories with flashbacks. Can you share some flashbacks with your child and ask them about theirs?

Polite reminders:
