

## Dear Parents/Guardians

Welcome back to a new school year and we hope that you have all had a lovely Summer. Over the past week, it has been great to see all the children back in school looking smart and ready to begin their new academic year. They have all settled in extremely well to their new classes and I know the teachers have really enjoyed getting to know their new classes this week. The children have been busy finding out about the class routines and rules and it has been lovely hearing our families talk about how much their children have enjoyed being back at school.

This year we are welcoming back Miss Rothwell from maternity leave, Miss Aldcroft joining us in Reception and Mrs Horridge working between Year 1 and 2. I am sure that you will join us in supporting them to settle in.

I would also like to extend a warm welcome to our new families and staff who have joined our Britannia family this week. I know that you will all support them as they begin their journey with us at Britannia. Remember that although it feels sad sometimes to see your child moving on, it also means that you are just moving onto a new adventure.

#### **Attendance**

Attendance at school is important and this is closely monitored throughout the year. We expect that children will attend school every day and arrive on time unless they are too unwell. A child whose attendance is below 90% is classed as persistently absent and school endeavours to work with families to improve these figures. This data is monitored by school, the local authority and the DFE. Our target for each child's attendance at Britannia is 96%. Should school have any concerns about your child's attendance, we will get in touch with you. Throughout the year, you will receive regular updates through use of a traffic light letter to keep you informed of your child's attendance. Regularly missing school can result in your child developing gaps in learning and difficulties with social interaction as friendships can move on. Holidays will not be authorised expect in special circumstances which must be discussed with the Headteacher and the governing body have taken the decision to fine for holidays during term time.


#### **Class Information**
