For Voluntary Aided, Foundation, Free Schools and Academies for Admission Purposes

The following terms used throughout this booklet are defined as below, except where individual arrangements spell out a different definition.

Distance

The 'straight line' method of measurement only applies for admission purposes. For transport 'walking routes' are used to determine distance. Explanations of these terms can be found in the main booklet.

Parents/Family Members

A parent is any person who has parental responsibility or care of the child. Where admission arrangements refer to 'parent's attendance at church' it is sufficient for just one parent to attend. 'Family members' include only parents and siblings.

Medical/Social/Welfare

Where schools have a medical/social/welfare admission criterion then this should take into account the circumstances of the child and the family. Please note the Local Authority information in the accompanying admissions booklet.

Looked After and Previously Looked After Children

The School Admissions Code [December 2014] states that within the oversubscription criteria, the highest priority **must** be given to looked after children and children who were looked after, but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order).

This includes children who are legally adopted from overseas. Relevant, legal documents must be provided to evidence the adoption.

A looked after child' (1) or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption (2) child arrangements order (residency order) (3) or special guardianship order (4).

(1) A 'looked after child' is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989) at the time of making an application to a school

(2) This includes children who were adopted under the Adoption Act 1976 (see section 12 adoption orders) and children who were adopted under the Adoption and Childrens Act 2002 (see section 46 adoption orders).

(3) Under the provisions of s.12 of the Children and Families Act 2014, which amend section 8 of the Children Act 1989, residence orders have now been replaced by child arrangements orders.

(4) See Section 14A of the Children Act 1989 which defines a 'special guardianship order' as an order appointing one or more individuals to be a child's special guardian (or special guardians).

Admission Authorities for faith schools may give priority to all looked after children and previously looked after children whether or not of the faith, but they must give priority to looked after children and previously looked after children of the faith before other children of the faith. Where any element of priority is given in relation to children not of the faith they must give priority to looked after children and previously looked after children not of the faith above other children not of the faith.

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



Information about Admission to Secondary Schools in Hyndburn, Ribble Valley, Burnley, Pendle and Rossendale

This information is about secondary schools in Hyndburn, Ribble Valley, Burnley, Pendle and Rossendale. Similar information about other areas is available from Area Education Offices listed on the first page of the booklet " Admissions to Lancashire Schools – Information for Parents". It is quite possible for you to state a preference for schools in different areas. You should, however, only submit one application form.

In this information, you will find brief details about each school including the admission number. This is the number of children who can be offered places at the school in September 2022. Any further information you may need is available if you contact either the schools concerned or the Area Education Office.

About the information provided about each school

You are given the basic details about each school – name, address, Headteacher's name etc, plus the total number of pupils who attend. You will be particularly interested in the number of places available for September 2022 – **the admission number**.

For Voluntary Aided Schools, Foundation Schools and Academies please note that this booklet contains summaries of the policies only. You must approach the school for a copy of their full admissions policy if you are thinking of applying.

For Community and Voluntary Controlled Schools, there is additional information given below the main school details. This refers to the intake of pupils in September 2021. On the left hand side, it states the number of places that were available for that year (the admission number) and the number of preferences that were received for the school.

For Voluntary Aided and Foundation Schools, Free Schools and Academies, similar information is given about the number of preferences expressed. You are also given some details of the admissions policy. This is individual to each school. Details about how the criteria were applied can be requested from the individual school.

Please note that for secondary schools in Lancashire's co-ordinated admission system, information is given about preferences expressed for 2021. Given the variety of Admissions Authorities involved and additional schools outside the co-ordinated system, the figures may need further interpretation for individual schools.

Parents for whom the previous level of application is an important issue are advised to discuss the matter with the Admissions Team at the Area Education Office or with the individual school concerned.

Admission Policy & Criteria for Community and Voluntary Controlled Schools in Hyndburn, Ribble Valley, Burnley, Pendle & Rossendale districts

An admission number will be published showing the maximum number of pupils that the school will admit in the Autumn Term 2022. Parents are given the opportunity to express three preferences for a secondary school. Published criteria are used to decide which children should be offered the available places. In secondary schools an equal preference system operates, whereby the three parental preferences are given equal status. Each preference will be considered equally against the admissions criteria.

When a secondary school is oversubscribed the following priorities apply in order:

- 1. Looked after children and those who have been previously looked after including those legally adopted overseas, (see note (x) below), then
- Children for whom the Local Authority accepts that there are exceptional medical, social or welfare reasons which are directly relevant to the school concerned. (See note (i) below) then
- 3. Children living within the school's geographical priority area with older brothers or sisters attending the school when the younger child will start, (see note iii below).
- 4. Children living within the school's geographical priority area, then
- 5. Children living outside the school's geographical priority area with older brothers or sisters still attending the school when the younger child will start (See note (iii) below) then
- 6. Children living outside the school's geographical priority area (see note (iv) below.

<u>Notes</u>

- (i) The medical, social and welfare criterion will consider issues relevant to the child and/or the family. This category may include children without a statement who have special needs.
- (ii) As required by law, all children with a Statement of Special Educational Needs/EHC naming a school will be admitted before the application of the over-subscription criteria. Children who have a statement for special needs have their applications considered separately.
- (iii) Brothers and sisters includes step children, half brothers and sisters, fostered and adopted children living with the same family at the same address (consideration may be given to applying this criterion to full brothers and sisters who reside at different addresses). The priority does not apply to siblings whose brothers and sisters transferred into a sixth form at 16+.
- (iv) The distance criterion which will be used as the tie breaker if there is oversubscription within any of the admission criteria; is a straight line (radial) measure. The distance measure is a straight-line measurement (radial) between the applicant's home address points and the address point of the school (co-ordinates provided by ordnance survey data).
- (v) A child's permanent address is the one where he/she normally lives and sleeps and goes to school from. Proof of residence may be requested at any time throughout the admission process, (including after a child has accessed a school place).
- (vi) The Local Authority will keep waiting lists for all Lancashire schools until 31 August 2022. These are kept in priority order using the school's published admission criteria. From 1 September 2022 for one school term only waiting lists will be retained by individual admission authorities (the Local authority for community and voluntary controlled schools and individual voluntary aided and trust schools will each retain their own list).

- (vii) Children will not normally be able to start school other than at the beginning of the term unless they have moved into the area or there are exceptional circumstances.
- (viii) Applications for school places which are received late will not necessarily be dealt with at the same time as those received by the set deadline. The reasons for a late application may be requested and where these are not exceptional the relevant admission criteria will be initially applied to all others received on time. The late application will be dealt with after this process.

Application forms received after the published closing date, will only be considered at that time if the following conditions apply:

- (a) if the number of preferences received for the school is below the published admission number or:
- (b) there are extenuating circumstances justifying a late application.

These may include:

- (a) parents moving into the County after the closing date;
- (b) parent/carer illness which required hospitalisation for the major part of the period between the publication of the composite prospectus and the closing date for applications.
- (ix) Where a child lives with one parent for part of the week and another for the rest of the week only one address will be accepted for a school admission application. This will normally be the one where the child wakes up for the majority of school days (Monday to Friday). Proof of residence may be requested at any time throughout the admissions process.
- (x) the highest priority **must** be given to looked after children¹ and children who were looked after, but ceased to be so because they were adopted² (or became subject to a residence order³ or special guardianship order⁴). Further references to previously looked after children in the Code means children who were adopted (or subject to residence orders or special guardianship orders) immediately following having been looked after. This includes children who are legally adopted from overseas. Relevant legal documents must be provided to evidence the adoption.

The Authority has a duty to co-ordinate admission arrangements for all Lancashire maintained schools. The Authority will ensure that all Lancashire parents whose children are transferring to reception or Year 7 classes, receive the offer of one secondary or primary school place on the agreed date.

Update on Faith Commitment and Church Attendance Which Has Been Affected by the Coronavirus - Church of England Schools and Academies

In the event that during the period specified for attendance at worship the church has been closed for public worship and has not provided alternative premises for that worship, the requirements of these admission arrangements in relation to attendance will only apply to the period when the church or alternative premises have been available for public worship.

SUMMARY OF POLICY ▼

THE CRITERIA

The Governors have a duty to admit children with statements of Special Educational Needs which name Mount Carmel RC High School.

Where the school receives more applications than there are places available, the governing body will offer places using the following priority order:

- 1. Children in public care and previously looked after children
- 2. a) Baptised Catholic pupils (refer to box a)
 - b) other pupils who attend a partner Catholic school (refer to box b)
- 3. pupils attending one of the 'Church & Oswaldtwistle Cluster' schools (refer to box c)
- 4. pupils who attend a Christian faith primary school (refer to box d)
- 5. a pupil who has a sibling who would be concurrently on roll at the school
- 6. any other pupil

Tie Break

Where there are more applicants for the available places within a category, then the distance between the Ordnance Survey address points for the school and the home measured in a straight line will be used as the final determining factor, nearer addresses having priority over more distant ones. This address point is within the body of the property and usually located at its centre. Where the cut-off point is for addresses within the same building, then the single measure between address points will apply and the Local Authority's system of a random draw will determine which address(es) receive the offer(s).

SUMMARY OF POLICY V

1. (a) Children in public care and previously looked after children.

This includes any "looked after child", "previously looked after children" and any child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, residence or special guardianship order. 'Looked after' means that the child was (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions.

(b) Children with special medical or social circumstances affecting the child where these needs can only be met at this school.

Professional supporting evidence from a professional, e.g. a doctor, psychologist, social worker, is essential if admission is to be made under the criterion for special medical or social circumstances, and such evidence must set out the particular reasons why St Christopher's is the most suitable school and the difficulties which would be caused if the child had to attend another school. Alternatively, the school should be named in an education and health care plan or statement.

- 2. Children who have attended All Saints Church of England Primary School, Clayton le Moors, or St James's Church of England Primary School, Altham, for the previous year, i.e. the whole of Year 5. A maximum of 28 pupils will be admitted under this criterion.
 - (a) <u>Children of staff of St Christopher's</u> Staff children are defined as the children of staff (teaching and non-teaching) who have been employed in the school for the whole of the two years prior to the closing date for applications.
 - (b) <u>Children who already have a sibling in St Christopher's.</u> Siblings are defined as full brother and sister (including those who live apart), step, half, foster and adopted brothers and sisters living at the same address, who are pupils at St Christopher's at the time of transfer.
 - (c) Other Children
- 3. Children with a parent/guardian who worships in a Church which is in full membership of Churches Together in England or the Evangelical Alliance or the North West Partnership.

The lists of Churches can be found on the Churches Together in England website at cte.org.uk, and for the Evangelical Alliance at eauk.org; and for the North West Partnership at northwestpartnership.com; lists are taken as on 1st September 2021. Churches in membership of the equivalent bodies to CTE in Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales are equally accepted.

(i) The children of staff

Staff children are defined as the children of staff (teaching and non-teaching) who have been employed in the school for the whole of the two years prior to the closing date for applications.

(ii) Children who already have a sibling in the school.

Once the tests have been marked parents/carers will be informed whether their child has reached the required standard. Pupils will need to show that they have the ability to benefit from the education provision of the school by reaching the required standard, although this will not guarantee a place if the number of pupils achieving this score exceeds the number of places available.

Our published admission number (PAN) is 180. As a designated Grammar School we are able to select our entire intake on the basis of high academic ability. As such, we do not have to fill all of our places if applicants have not reached the required standard within our selection procedure.

The selection procedure is the entrance examination, held on site at the school, which any pupil in his or her last year of primary school and who will have reached the age of 11 years (but not 12 years) by the 31st of August in the year of entry, is eligible to sit.

The admissions authority determines that Bacup and Rawtenstall Grammar School is established primarily for the education of children attending Rossendale schools. Our admissions policy prioritises children from Rossendale primary schools (Area 1 and 2 schools below).

ALLOCATION OF PLACES

We will allocate a place to any child with a Statement of Educational Need or an Education, Health and Care Plan that names this school, provided the child has reached the required standard within our selection procedure.

We will then allocate places to children who have met the required standard in the following way, applying our oversubscription criteria where necessary.

In line with the DFE School Admission Code of Practice, priority in allocation of places will be given to looked after children (LAC) and adopted children (previously looked after children; internationally adopted previously looked after children – PLAC/IAPLAC), and then to:

• pupils attending Area 1 primary schools (ranked in order of overall entrance examination mark)

- pupils attending Area 2 primary schools (ranked in order of overall entrance examination mark)
- pupils **not** attending Area 1 or 2 primary schools (ranked in order of overall entrance examination mark).

For the purposes of this policy, attendance at an Area 1 or 2 primary school is defined as being for the duration of year 6, as a minimum. Attention is drawn to sections 2.12 and 2.13 of the School Admissions Code (2014) relating to the withdrawal of places following fraudulent or misleading applications.

Where two (or more) pupils have the same ranking, and there are not enough places remaining for them all, then the proximity of their home address to the school is considered, those living nearest to school being given priority. This distance is measured using the postal address of the school, in a direct line to the actual address for the child's home. The child's address must be the current one at the time of application – this will normally be the one where the child wakes up for the majority of Monday to Friday mornings.

When the published admission number is reached, pupils will be placed on a waiting list, maintained until the end of December of the admission year. This waiting list will be ranked in the manner indicated above for the allocation of places.

In September 2022, free school transport will be provided as follows:

General Policy

To qualify for free home to school transport, children of compulsory school age are required to attend the nearest suitable school, where the home to school distance (based on the child's address) using the shortest route is over 2 miles for children up to the age of 8 years. At the start of the academic year, after the child's 8th birthday, a reassessment will take place as children 8 years and over will only qualify for transport assistance if the shortest route is over 3 miles.

For Lancashire families, schools outside of their GPA (Geographical Priority Area) and those in other Local Authorities and districts will be considered when assessing eligibility for assistance for transport to school.

For those pupils attending faith schools, the Council previously granted partial assistance with travel costs if the pupil attended the nearest school of their faith. Since September 2018 transport assistance is only available if a pupil attends their nearest school or academy and meets the distance criteria.

Please note; if parents decide to send their child to a school that is not their nearest suitable school, then they will be responsible for the cost of transporting their child to that school/academy.

The basis for payment of travelling expenses

From September 2018, the County Council removed the discretionary element of the Home to School Transport policy and so there is no longer any denominational transport assistance available for new pupils starting at either primary or secondary schools in September 2022, unless the family meet the low income criteria (see below).

(Transport Assistance will still be provided for existing pupils as it has been agreed that the changes in policy are phased-in so that children who started school under one set of transport arrangements continue to benefit from them until they either conclude their education at the school, choose to move to another school or move home address.)

National Extended Rights Policy (Low Income)

If your child does not qualify for transport under the general policy (above), a national policy provides extended rights to children who are eligible for free school meals or whose parents receive the maximum level of Working Tax Credit (WTC) i.e. reduction to the income must be £0.00 on your award notice. This policy provides transport for:

Primary Children – age 8 but under 11 years, transport will be provided to the nearest suitable school where that school is more than 2 miles from the child's home.

Secondary Children – transport to one of the 3 nearest suitable qualifying schools where the school is more than 2 but less than 6 miles from the child's home OR transport to the nearest suitable secondary school preferred because of your religion or belief for children whose parents adhere to that particular faith, if the school is between 2 and 15 miles from home.

Concessionary Travel

If your child is not eligible for free travel you may be able to purchase a season ticket if there are spare places on a school transport service. Please contact the School Traveline for advice on 0300 123 6738.

In some cases it may be more cost effective for your child to travel on a public bus service and purchase a discounted period travel ticket direct from the bus operator.
