Dear Parents/Guardians

As we approach the end of 2020, the time has come back to reflect on a strange and somewhat challenging year. The Britannia school community has once again been the shining light through a period of turmoil and I feel incredibly proud to lead such a wonderful school. It is vital that you tell us about positive tests so that we can help to protect our community and prevent the further spread of coronavirus in our community.
